Pair of 'vulnerable' cheer pheasants released into wild near Shimla

Had been reared at Khundian pheasantry as part of programme to conserve, breed and reintroduce them into their habitat amid concerns of dwindling numbers

paray both inhedutantines con SHIMIA: A mid divinding population, the forest department released a pair Cheer Pheasants, categorised as vulnerable under The International Union for Conservation of Nature, into the wild in Shilli Mehla, a village in Chaon near Shimla.

Divisional forest officer Ravi Shankar, said. The released birds will now be monitored intensively by a team of research assistant, forest guard and field assistant. Pursuant to this purpose, 12 cannera traps have been laid across the habi-tat in the radius of 12 square kms from the soft pen.

Notably, the first set of cheer pheasants were released into the wild in Seri village, Dar-blog, by the department in

cheer pheasant in captivity at Chail. The Central Zoo Author-ity then gave its nod for the con-servation breeding project in 2006. A total of 12 birds have been

The survey indicated that the site also had a low population of cheer pheasants and occasional presence of the birds.

For the first time in 1979, the department conducted a survey to estimate the cheer pheasant

population in the Chail Sanctu-ary. The surveyors found 40 pairs of pheasants in the sanctu-ary area. Four years later, the population declined by 50%.
